

## CITY COMMISSION

### Description of Operation:

The City Commission is the governing body of the City of Sarasota and has the power to make and enforce all laws and regulations with respect to municipal affairs, subject only to the limitations and restrictions of the City Charter and the State Constitution. The City Commission has the power, in the name of the City, to do whatever is appropriate for the municipality and the general welfare of the City's inhabitants, unless it is specifically forbidden by the State Constitution.

The five member City Commission is non-partisan and from this group, one will be chosen Mayor and another Vice Mayor, each to serve a one-year term. The City has been divided into three voting districts, each to be represented by a Commissioner elected by voters in that district. The City as a whole is represented by three Commissioners who are elected at one time and two at-large Commissioners who are elected two years later.

The City Commission appoints the Administrative Officers: City Manager, City Auditor and Clerk, City Attorney and members of all Advisory Boards and Committees, all of whom serve at the pleasure of the Commission.
