New WEB TPA Representative – Kurt Hoverter

- Tom Dolsak left WEB-TPA. Kristi Hassinger has replaced him and Kim Hall is the Claims Manager.

Dependent Eligibility Audit – Kurt Hoverter

- Tom Dolsak has started with a new company, HRAdvance. It completes dependent eligibility audits.
 - Ensures dependents on benefit plans are eligible to be covered.
 - If the City does the audit, it is a \$35,000-40,000 expense.
 - His company states that 12 ½% of the people covered should not be.
 - If 2-3% of dependents on plans are ineligible, it would most likely more than pay for the cost. One bad claim could cover the cost.
 - Employees would receive 90 days amnesty period to remove ineligible dependents from benefit plans without any penalty or punitive action.

Other Business

- Al Woodle discussed pill splitting and stated that Caremark prescriptions are for 90 days per the Summary Plan Description. Any real savings would require changing the verbiage with Caremark.
- Linda McKinney stated she has not heard of any further discussion on the City being the beneficiary on the life insurance presentation relating to OPEB.
- Robert Blinch-Edwards was presented with a plaque in appreciation for his work at Healthcare of Sarasota.
- Andrew Grindstaff will be our Healthcare of Sarasota representative until the end of the year.
